Role Purpose

The post-holder is responsible for four main areas of school cricket:

Senior Team Cricket, including the 1st and 2nd Team

Player development and performance

Girls' cricket

CHS Cricket in the Community

Responsibilities

Senior Team Cricket

- Recruit and retain high-performing senior cricketers;
- Develop and lead the 1st and 2nd senior teams including practices, fixtures, festivals and overseas tours;
- Develop a 12 month holistic programme for senior cricketers;
- Deliver 1-1 and team sessions;
- Develop strong links with professional clubs;
- Work with the Head of Cricket to develop a strategic plan for the future of CHS cricket.

Player Development and Performance

- Liaise with the Head of Cricket to develop and implement a bespoke Elite Player Development Programme for boys and girls from Years 7 – 13;
- Work with the Head of Cricket to develop and deliver B Team fixtures/practices/1-1 sessions;
- Foster excellent relations with local clubs and academies;
- Take responsibility for 1st XI performance;
- Take responsibility for students' progression into county academies.

Girls' Cricket

- Develop and implement a year-long Girls' cricket programme;
- Develop and implement regular fixtures in both the 'hard ball' and 'soft ball' version of the game;
- Develop and foster club links with local Girls' clubs and county academies;
- Host a Girls' Cricket Festival across all age groups;
- Lead a Girls' Cricket Tour;
- Develop a Girls' 1st XI team.

Community

- Deliver CPD sessions for current CHS Staff;
- Deliver CPD sessions for teachers and coaches at local schools and clubs;
- Organise and host primary school Cricket Festivals;
- Liaise with the Head of Cricket and Director of Sport to increase the opportunities for students to play cricket in local state primary and secondary schools;
- Work alongside Academies and the ECB to build on national initiatives.

General

- Umpire fixtures when required;
- Support the Junior School and Senior School Games programme, as required;
- Contribute to the overall sports Co-Curricular programme, including taking teams on Saturdays in Term 1 and Term 2;
- Follow the CHS Sport Co-Curricular Expectations;
- Support the PE & Games Cover provision.

This is not an exhaustive list, and will vary as the School's requirements change. Flexibility regarding working hours (including Saturdays), may be expected from time to time, in consultation with the employee.
