
ALVANLEY OUT OF VILLAGE CUP

ALDERLEY EDGE MAKE IT SUCCESSIVE T20 TRIUMPHS

Perry-Perry the source for AE's record breaking win on scorching finals day



2022 finals day saw four Premier Division heavyweights going head to head, all sides in excellent recent league form and all enjoying convincing wins the day before. It was Alderley Edge's Sam Perry who cemented his reputation as the best batter in Cheshire, 76 off 55 bs in their semi followed by the first ever century in a T20 final, as AE chased down the highest ever score made in a T20 final to make it back-to-back wins for the Moss Lane club. In the final, three-time winners Chester BH (making their sixth appearance on finals day) scored 197-7 after being put in, a record total for a final. A blistering start courtesy of Messers

Qureshi, Goodwin and Duffy saw CBH race to 77-1 after the 6 powerplay overs, and even though Duffy fell two balls later, Alex Money ensured no let up as CBH reached the halfway point 110-3 and looked set for a monster score. The pivotal moment occurred in the 14th over, when both Money and Rick Moore fell, meaning a relatively

modest 41 runs came from the last five overs - some comfort for AE, but a sizeable task nonetheless on what was still a hot afternoon. AE's reply became an object lesson in chasing, starting quietly with just three 4s in their powerplay (their total 40-1), but it was the coming together of captain Ed Foster with Perry that proved decisive. No strangers to fruitful stands, the pair added a magnificent 142 in just 11.2 overs with a barely perceptible acceleration, both reaching 50 off 30 bs, and although Foster was well run out in the 18th over, Perry remained dominant, finishing with an imperious 13th four to bring up a brilliant hundred (54 bs) and simultaneously take AE to a quite remarkable 200-3 with two deliveries remaining. So, as last year, Alderley Edge will fly the Cheshire flag in the regional rounds, and again as last year will take on Menai Bridge CC at Smethwick CC (Birmingham) on Sun Aug 7th (13:00) with the winners taking on the

CCCL PREMIER DIVISION



WK 13 - JULY 16

Three of the four T20 finalists enjoyed comfortable wins with extra 'feet up' time as the heat really started to build in the Premier Division. Hyde showed no signs of letting up in their pursuit of the title with an untroubled win over Didsbury, whose great start to the season continued to stutter, just one win in their last four. After a bright start the Dids batting faltered at Werneth Low, 5 wkts apiece for Andrew Jackson and Charlie Barnard as Hyde were set 174. A sparkling 68 from Noah Vickery propelled them to victory in the 35th over. Chester BH moved up to second with a fifth straight win, as they bowled Widnes out for just 116 and knocked off the runs within 24 overs, **Rick Moore** finishing 59*. Alderley Edge were the other team with the luxury of an early finish as they demolished Oxton, who were bowled out for 97 as AE made it four wins in their last five, their 7 wkt win completed in the 19th over. Nantwich had to work hardest for their 25 pts, Marcus Stables making his third ton of 2022, a run-a-ball 119 powering them to a successful pursuit of 245 at Toft. A terrific match at Brooklands saw visitors Neston snatch an 11 run win in a high scoring encounter. Dom Smith made a superb 109* as the visitors notched their highest total of the season, 257-6. Todd Walker hit 88 but Rowan Shelton's 6 wkts put the skids under Brooklands, who lost 4 wkts without addition on 155. The hosts revived with a 7th wkt stand of 69 but a pacy burst from Ash Davis finally did for them. Meantime bottom side Bowdon produced an excellent display to bag their second 25 pts of the season with a 6 wkt win at struggling Oulton Park. Put into bat, a last wkt stand of 37 lifted OP to 178, and when Ben Gibbon struck twice to leave Bowdon 13-2 the hosts were in with a shout. Ross Zelem remained defiant however, batting throughout to record a brilliant 100* as skipper Matt Tully hit a six to seal a superb 6 wkt win. OP slipped into a relegation spot as a result but four of the bottom five were separated by just six pts after today's round of matches.

WK 15 - JULY 30

A remarkable innings of 128* from Noah Vickery saw Hyde maintain their title push with a five wkt win over Toft. Chasing a moderate 192, Hyde were in real trouble at 87-6 but Vickery, who hit 13 sixes and 8 fours in his 81 ball knock, added an unbroken 113 with Andrew Jackson as Hyde raced to win no.12. There was an equally remarkable recovery at Little Budworth as Sam Leech (63* off 45 bs) and Liam Booth (31*) added an unbroken 90 for the 9th wkt to take Didsbury to a stunning 2 wkt win against Oulton Park, for whom Martyn East had earlier scored a superb 105 as OP reached 204-7 in a reduced 48 overs. With Dids teetering on 117-8 OP looked in sight of a first win since May but saw it snatched away. Talking about last winning in May, Oxton produced a glorious batting performance to sweep Bowdon aside, Joe Mennie (64) and Luke Filer (53*) adding 122 for their 1st wkt to all but assure a 9 wkt victory. Back at the



WK 14 - JULY 23

Hyde's lead was significantly trimmed after they suffered their first league reverse since May 21, going down by 95 runs at bang inform Nantwich. Putting the hosts in, Dan Cranmer led his charges - with George Balderson available to play - expertly, reducing Nantwich to 139-8 in the 45th, but seven overs later, Scott Wardley and Phil Stockton had added 51 to post a total of 194. Stockton and Jimmy Warrington then tore into the powerful Hyde batting, which was all but blown away in 23 relentless overs as Hyde folded for just 92. Another equally redoubtable batting line up, that of Chester BH, also surprisingly capitulated at Didsbury chasing just 185, CBH collapsing from 93-5 to 112 all out as Dids did the double over CBH for the first time. Alderley Edge's fifth win in six - a comfortable 8 wkt win at Toft kept them very much in the title hunt, with 40 pts covering the top five at stumps. It was even tighter at the bottom, with just 3 pts covering five clubs. Oulton Park slid from 49-0 to 58-5 in their 47 run loss at Widnes, for whom Ali Chugtai made the standout inns of 64. OP went bottom as a result, but only a point behind Bowdon, who, with both Chapple senior and junior in their side, conjured a nerve-wracking 1 wkt win in a 60 over match against Brooklands, James Bottomley the hero with 22* and 3-37. Rowan Shelton made it successive six-wkt hauls as Neston made it three wins in a row, despatching struggling Oxton for just 123 and going onto win by 4 wkts. Oxton, who won their first four games in 2002, haven't won since, gaining just 41 more pts.

top, Nantwich squeezed home in the battle of the big guns at Filkins Lane in a match reduced to 90 overs, bowling out a strong Chester side for 155 and then holding off an attack strengthened by Cole Turner (4-30) as Marcus Stables (53) impressed again. Alderley Edge rounded off an excellent month for them with a curious 71 run win over Neston, AE labouring to 143-9 in 48 overs at Moss Lane before despatching the visitors for just 72. A very different tale at Brooklands who hammered 331-7, Kevin Carroll (87) and AJ Hart (60) adding 128 in 17 overs at one stage. Widnes replied with a spirited 254-9 (Luke McCoy 67), Hart taking 6-69 as the match was drawn.

WK 13 - JULY 16

Div 1 was absolutely the place for dramatic cricket on matchday 13. Cheadle played out a thrilling draw at Alvanley after the hosts posted a feisty 247-8. Jarryd Basson making 88 and the lower order whacking 71 between them to set the visitors their biggest target of the season. Liam Fitzpatrick's 58 helped set the base and the lower order got within one hit of a win as nerves on all sides were evident, Cheadle finishing 245-7. That result enabled **Grappenhall** to leapfrog them after their 10th straight win, four wkts apiece for Ed Barnes and Aaron McCabe paving the way for a 5 wkt win at Marple. Two other form sides, Sale and Timperley, both won, Sale enjoying a super all-round display from Dan Newton who finished 96* after taking 4-25 in their 6 wkt win over Bramhall, for whom Nick Cantello again shone with 84. Timpers had a thrilling one run win at Bollington, eight of their ten batters making double figures including Chris Page, who took 14 off the last over as Timpers posted 241-8. Bolly slumped to 145-7 in the 39th over but a brilliant lower order fightback led by Cameron Smail's 48 left Bolly needing 10 off the last. Tom Horsfield then hit the first ball of over 50 for six, but was caught off the last ball going for the winning hit in a thoroughly gripping climax. Quite incredibly, for the second time in three weeks Urmston were almost involved in a level scores draw, 67 from Lewis Jackson the highest of several chunky contributions in their 250-5 at home to Lindow. Ryan O'Brien then made a magnificent 105, putting on 106 for the 3rd wkt with Johan Wessels (53), the visitors needing 65 off the last 8 with 7 wkts in hand. Amidst a steady flow of wickets and runs, three were needed off the last ball, skipper Alex Matthews run out going for a second as Lindow finished 249-8. Veteran Rob Porter took 3-22 and top scored with 46 as Macclesfield won by 7 wkts at Congleton.

WK 15 - JULY 30

The match of the day turned out to be a drawn fixture at Upcast Lane where hosts **Lindow** played out a high scoring thriller with in-form Timperley. In a match reduced to 46 overs each, Timpers were 156-6 in the 29th before an explosive 7th wkt stand of 131 in just 12 overs by Jonathan Fowler (67 off 36) and Ed Galley (78 off 59) powered them to 287-7, giving Lindow an extra six overs to chase. Johan Wessels was joined by Finn Gavaghan in the 33rd over at 151-4, the pair then adding 125 before Gavaghan (56) was out, 10 needed off the last over. Despite the best efforts of Wessels, who finished unbeaten on 120, Timpers kept it to six. It was still a great July for Timpers, who were second only to Grappenhall in the form table, Grappers winning again with something to spare as struggling Alvanley were brushed aside at Broad Lane. Ben Broadhurst produced a remarkable return of 8-23 as Cheadle demolished Sale at Dane Rd, the hosts all out for just 66, while not so far away at Urmston an almost identical occurrence was going on as Bramhall were shot out for just 65, Joshua Edwards taking 7-26 as Urmston completed a welcome first win in six games. Rob Porter took 2-23 and made 54 as Macclesfield beat Marple by 6 wkts, Ben Curwen with a five-for for Macc as Marple's indifferent form continued. Bollington remain bottom of the pile but notched their first win since the opening day in a 90 over game at the Recreation Ground, when their 189-7 proved 80 too many for Congleton, **Toby Phipps** playing his first game since April for Bolly and taking 5-24.

WK 14 - JULY 23 Grappenhall continued their promotion surge with an eleventh win in a row, comfortably defeating Macclesfield in a reduced overs game, Albert Pennington the start turn with 6-40 and 47* in their 76 run win. Meanwhile Cheadle recorded consecutive draws after a stubborn Bollington rearguard denied them at Kingsway, **Liam Fitzpatrick's** rapid 74* the match highlight. Timperley's fifth straight win enabled them to close the gap to second spot by 35 pts after they produced an impressive display to beat in-form Sale by 7 wkts, Johan Harms (79*) and Jonathan Fletcher (65) adding 124 for the 3rd wkt. It was equally emphatic at Booth St as Congleton's Tom Leese (71*) oversaw a 9 wkt win over Alvanley, who are now winless in six. Despite some good displays, Urmston are another side in a rut with just one win in eight, and they were not helped by how the reduced overs panned out at Marple. Mark Bennett scored a fine ton for the hosts as they declared on 206-8, Urmston eventually ending up with just 32 overs, 147-5 their total. Bramhall remain in the clutch of sides separated by a few points but their third win in four - a 69 run win over Lindow - gave them a welcome lift. And indeed, as Sean McNicholl gave it the beans with 8-42, only a last wkt stand of 60 put any gloss on Lindow's 94 all out. Incidentally the 30 extras Lindow gave away in the match meant they have now conceded 353 all told in 2022.


