CHESHIRE WOMEN'S LEAGUE

Division One - May 28:

<u>Didsbury v Stockport Georgians</u>: Didsbury go marching on with this commanding win. Stacey Miles removed the two previously prolific Georgians openers, then it was over to Zara Matthews, whose 6-3 return blitzed the rest of the Stockport batting line up. The first clash between unbeaten Didsbury and Leigh is this Sunday (June 11).

Didsbury's Rosie Davis is set to join the list of League players who have played international cricket as she has been selected in the Guernsey squad to play a three-match series against Jersey in June and a five-match away series against Austria in August.

Stockport Georgians' Liv Bell made her debut for the Thunder regional team on May 31, taking two wickets in her side's four-wicket loss to Southern Vipers, followed by two more in the win over South East Stars. She becomes the first player from the Cheshire Youth pathway to make it to regional championship level since Sophie Ecclestone.

<u>Upton v Nantwich</u>: Nantwich won by six wickets to continue their good start to the season, and there was little doubt as to what was the most eye-catching performance. Eleanor Sinker had already illustrated what a good acquisition she is with her five-wicket haul in the win over Appleton, and here she bowled an incredible 47 consecutive dot balls, before finally conceding a single from her final delivery, while in sight of the league's first ever 'clean sheet' in a full eight over spell. Chester Boughton Hall's Ali Cutler was the only bowler to have conceded just one from an eight over spell in the past.

June 4:

Stockport Georgians v Appleton: Fantastic entertainment was on offer in Stockport, where one opener from each team narrowly missed out on a hundred. Emma Barlow made 95 for Appleton, almost adding to her career collection of hundreds, and although she dominated the scoring in the early overs, when she got support from the likes of Amy Seddon, the final total of 193 for the Warrington club looked a challenging one. A seesaw run chase followed, with Appleton in the ascendancy when they snared Heidi Cheadle early on, then Georgians gaining control via a stand of 103 between Skye Thomas and Freya Jones. Things looked to be going Appleton's way when Jenny Arnold's wickets engineered a collapse of four for 14, only for Louisa Boyle to play a vital late role in getting Georgians over the line. At just 13 years of age, Thomas' innings of 94 was one of high promise, working the gaps well in addition to putting away the bad ball, but after she fell for 94 just before the close, it ensured that Chester's Megan Cureton remained the youngest centurion in league history, for now at least.

<u>Chester Boughton Hall v Oakmere</u>: Natalie Lyons' 71 rescued Oakmere from a difficult start, but an unbeaten 62 from Katie Bennett saw Chester home with one ball to spare.

Division Two - June 4:

<u>Hayfield v Greenfield</u>: In this battle of two promoted teams, it was Hayfield who secured their first win at this level. After being in a perilous position at 49-4, a stand of 90 between Rhiannon Cowan and Charlotte Peacock took the girls from the High Peak to their victory target.

Oxton v Hawarden Park: A thumping win for Hawarden, who now have three wins from three. Poppy Smith (71*) and Nicola Deane (69) scored the lion's share of their runs, before they dismissed Oxton cheaply.

Division Three West – May 15:

<u>Appleton 2nd XI v Nantwich 2nd XI</u>: Appleton were pegged back after a rapid start, with Nantwich eventually getting home in the final over.

A few reminders from the League Committee meeting on May 21 regarding Play Cricket entries and fixtures issues:

- Please let me know if a match does not take place on the scheduled date, e.g. due to weather conditions, ground unavailability or either side being unable to fulfil the fixture
- Please ensure you rectify any Unsure entries on your team's PC scorecards, together with any players whose name is not linked to their PC statistics (these are players shown in red on the admin view of the match scorecard)
- If your club is unable to provide a scorer, please ensure the opposition are provided with all
 player names on the day of the match (including the names of those taking catches and
 effecting run outs)
- Please enter the batting and bowling points when entering a result. These are explained in the relevant competition regulations
- Please note that full match scorecards need to be on PC within five days of each match.
 Please be aware that league regulations now stipulate a five-point penalty for the third and subsequent occasion that a home club fails to do this.

The League is not currently in a position to re-open its Small Grants application process. There are still funds, however, available for clubs to purchase coloured playing kit, should you be currently playing in whites and want to make the switch. Coloured clothing is now permitted in all competitions administered by the League.

The League's representative XI will play the MCC at Chester Boughton Hall CC on Friday July 28 at 1130.

Nominations for the team are now requested from club managers and captains. Players wishing to nominate themselves are also very welcome to do so.

Players with CWCL clubs based outside of Cheshire are most certainly welcome in the team, as are those that play senior or junior representative cricket for counties other than Cheshire. The only basic criteria are that they expect to be available on the day, and that they play regular weekend cricket for a League member club.

Clubs are also welcome to nominate up to two players as additional fielders - this might be a great way of getting people involved, even if you feel they haven't yet reached the ideal standard for senior representative cricket. It's also a great way of involving lower division clubs.

We also need to provide at least one scorer, so would love to hear from anyone interested in this. Please send me any nominations by June 25.

The host club's women's first team captain Nicole Fisher will lead the League XI on the day.

Hale Barns CC will host Finals Day for the League on Sunday September 3.

The next meeting of the League Committee will be on Wednesday July 26 at 1930.
