Safe Hands Guidance and new Safeguarding Club Policy Template

As you will be aware from our October newsletter, the ECB Safeguarding Team have been reviewing and updating the Safe Hands Policy, Guidance and Templates.

This has been a significant piece of work which has been undertaken over the last 6 months ensuring we provide consistent guidance on topics which sat in the Safe Hands Policy. This was achieved by the support of the whole cricket network including recreational clubs and County Safeguarding Officers.

We are delighted to inform you we are now able to launch the first batch of these documents and templates, you can find these online on the ECB website from today. We are still progressing further guidance and templates which will be available early in the new year, we will of course update you further once these have been released.

One of the most significant changes we have made is around the requirement for recreational clubs to hold a safeguarding policy. We are now asking clubs to complete the Safeguarding Policy Statement which asks them to agree to Safe Hands being the single safeguarding policy for the game. This will hopefully be seen as a positive step forward, to reduce the workload for our volunteer Club Safeguarding Officers and provide consistency across our club network.

Scorers – Change to DBS Requirements

The ECB have been reviewing the role of Scorer against the requirements of DBS, taking into consideration the role definition and the legal definition of Regulated Activity. We undertake these reviews, on all roles, to ensure we are working within and not in breach of any legal requirements.

Following our most recent review, it has been concluded that the role of Scorer does not meet the legal requirements for an Enhanced DBS.

In short, when an individual is contacted for their annual DBS recheck, they will need to complete a questionnaire via a link provided. They will be asked to select the most appropriate role/ options from the drop-down menu. Depending on their answers, they will receive confirmation as to whether their DBS can be renewed for their remaining role/s in cricket or their DBS can be lapsed in line with the changes.

If an individual is not registered to the Update Service but wishes to continue in Cricket in another role that is in regulated activity, then a new application will be required.

Scorers will still be required to undertake the online Safeguarding for Specialist Roles (SSR) eLearning training every 3 years and are encouraged to follow other safeguarding best practice guidance, such as not being alone with a child, following the rule of two.

Smartsheet for Low Level Concerns

The deadline for inputting your historic data from 2022/2023 has now passed. Thank you to those of you who have shared information into your Smartsheet workspaces.

We have had a meeting to review and make amendments to Smartsheet based on improvements we have identified and recommendations you have provided. These changes are underway in the background, they won't impact upon you continuing to use the system.

We will be in contact again in the New Year to share details of the improvements made, to provide you with some information you may want to share with Clubs ahead of new season and to send out the updated Low Level Concerns Policy template.

Safeguarding for Specialist Multiple Roles (eLearning)

As a reminder Safeguarding for Specialist Multiple Roles has now replaced Safeguarding Young Cricketers. To complete the course all learners should complete the main module, titled Safeguarding for Specialist Roles (80%) and one of the bolt-on modules (20%) relevant to their role.

- Safeguarding for Committee Members (Safeguarding Officers should complete this course and this course is added to them automatically when signing up for a Safe Hands course)
- Safeguarding for Coaches & Activators
- Safeguarding for Captains & Team Managers
- Safeguarding for Umpires & Scorers

If an individual has more than one role in cricket, they should choose their primary role first but are welcome to complete additional bolt on modules for any additional roles.

County Boards should administer these courses on C-Vent and have the registration links available on their individual websites.

When completing the training it is important that the grey bar at the top of the screen has turned completely red for each section. If you skip to the end of the course without each section being fully completed, then a certificate to download/print will not become available.

Tip – *Hover your cursor on the bar at the top of each section at the point where it goes from red to grey.* This will show tabs of all the items. The reds are complete, but the white ones haven't been opened.
