Cheshire Cricket Board Communities (Urban) Action Plan 2024-2026

The Cheshire Cricket Board Urban Action Plan underlines our commitment to developing and delivering cricket within non-traditional playing environments throughout Cheshire.



Working alongside key partners and stakeholders, we have outlined a number of community-based activities designed to enrich the lives of those living in urban areas so that every member of our Cheshire family can confidently say: "Cricket is a game for me."

This Action Plan is divided into four pillars (see below), each with associated tasks, aims and objectives. We have also identified some key performance indicators (KPIs) to enable us to measure progress and to refine and restructure our goals where appropriate.

The four pillars:

- 1. Participation and Pathway
- 2. People
- 3. Places
- 4. Partnerships

The Urban Action Plan is one of several development strategies published by CCB and as such should not be read in isolation. Our Equity, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) Action Plan was last updated in January 2024, while the overarching CCB Countywide Plan promises to provide 'opportunities for all' through the delivery of our Urban and Disability programmes. All CCB plans are reviewed and updated on an annual basis and can be accessed via the Cheshire Cricket Board website.
