## WK 3 STANDOUT STATS

Although some grounds are still struggling with the legacy of the wet pre-season there was markedly more cricket played across an increasingly pleasant weekend.

In the [Premier Division](#), four sides (Chester BH, Grappenhall, Hyde and Nantwich) made it two wins from two. A tough return to the top flight for Timperley, who despite a last wkt stand of 46, were soundly beaten at Whitehouse Lane, Luke Robinson's 84\* for the Dabbers the highest individual score of the day in the division as they raced to their 139 target in under 18 overs. Henry Dobson made 81 for Oxton in an impressive win over champions Alderley Edge, while Grappers' Tom MacRury continued his fine form of last season with 10-2-21-2 and 67 off 43 as they beat Toft.

[Div 1](#) had two cancelled fixtures but also saw the first ton of the 1st XI season, one of Lindow's new recruits Dan Newton hitting 113 (116 bs) as he and fellow signing from Sale Isaac Brooks added 103 for the 8th wkt, enough to see off Brooklands. Marple lead the early table after beating Cheadle, while Sale - playing their first game - and Macclesfield got their first wins, the latter benefitting from 35 wides donated by the rusty Romiley attack.

In [Div 2](#) Haslington captain Ben Istead led from the front at Ashton OM, masterminding his side's recovery from 83-8 to 207-9 as he ended 96\* in what became a handsome 116 run win. Despite conceding 46 extras, Cheadle Hulme got going with a win over Congleton, who find themselves at the foot of the early table. Another of the Balderson dynasty shone in that game, Tom taking 5-22 for CH. Maritime beat Alvanley to make it successive wins for them, while the longest journey of the day for Bollington ended in defeat at Port Sunlight despite Tyran Liddiard's 84. An altogether shorter ride for NEC, for whom Toby Carson took 6-18 as they recorded a thumping win at Cale Green, Stockport all out 73.

[Div 3](#) had three games called off but there were wins for Kingsley, Oakmere and Tattehall, the latter winning by 42 runs at Winnington Park despite their top three all bagging ducks. Freddie Cheshire had a fine game for Tatt with 38 and 3-22. Zac Aldridge's 6-32 and joint top score of 27 for Barrow was in vain as they went down by 56 runs at Oakmere.

In the [2nd XI Prem](#), there were two near-centurions, Hyde's Charlie Harris (one of three Charlies in the team) making 97 as his side beat Widnes. Lindow's Henry James got even closer, making 99 out of 178-9 against Brooklands, who went on to make it two from two with a 4 wkt win. James Hodgson's 8-35 was not enough for Toft as Stockport Georgians held on for a nerve-jangling 1 wkt win at Booth's Park.
