# **CHESHIRE WOMEN'S LEAGUE**

Division One – June 16:

Chester Boughton Hall v Didsbury: Boughton Hall pulled off the third highest successful run chase in league history – a list in which they also hold the top two spots – to inflict further damage on Didsbury's faltering hopes of retaining the league. When Chester set the record at Stockport Trinity two years ago, Trinity had Ellie Mason on the losing side despite scoring 160 runs by herself. Today Didsbury's Roshini Prince-Navaratnam was on the losing side despite a personal score of 141, made from 122 balls with 20 fours and one six. None of her team-mates passed 11. Georgia Munro made 81 in the opener's slot and Holly Mayers added 49 at number three, followed later by a crucial 32 from Holly Cooke, and there were all of 17 balls in hand when Chester got over the line.

Oakmere v Lindow: Lindow remain unbeaten in all competitions, and while there have been eyecatching individual batting performances from their big-name stars in previous matches, this win owed a lot to their home grown and youthful bowling line up. Grace Hemsted's 3-11 was the best analysis as Oakmere were under pressure right from the start, eventually making just 94. Three of Lindow's first four fell cheaply, but Hemsted stood firm, eventually joined by Holly Topp to complete matters with a flourish.

Stockport Georgians v Appleton: Georgians decisively won this battle of the bottom two to record their first league win of the year, while leaving Appleton still searching for a first victory. Breanna Craven's opening spell of 3-12 inflicted the early damage and Appleton never recovered, stumbling to 66 all out as there were further bowling successes for Neve Boon and Brooke Noden. Georgians then needed just 13.2 overs to complete an eight-wicket win.

Leigh v Nantwich - cancelled due to unfit ground

## **June 23:**

Chester Boughton Hall v Lindow: There's certainly no stopping Lindow here, as they equalled the league record for the highest Division 1 team score - the same total of 303 was made by Nantwich two years ago. Heidi Cheadle meanwhile bagged an individual record of her own as her remarkable innings of 172 is the highest ever made in Division 1 and the second highest in league history. 24 fours and three sixes from the 124 balls she faced completed this landmark performance, and Holly Topp (69) combined with her to add 153 for the first wicket. Chester have been involved in a number of high scoring matches over the years, especially on their superb home batting tracks, and their contribution to the game here was to make 218, itself the second highest losing team score in league history. Katie Bennet (44) was their top scorer, and amidst the carnage, Lindow's Libby Ackerley was the only bowler on either side to have an economy rate of less than four.

Nantwich v Stockport Georgians: Nantwich still have a 100 per cent record from league matches where the weather has allowed them to take the field, but they were given a huge scare here by Georgians' Skye Thomas, whose 86 not out from 74 deliveries dominated a second innings score of 147. Ultimately, the young opener rain out of partners as Eleanor Sinker's 5-26 proved to be a matchwinning spell. Grace Michell (52) and Beth Hughes (45) were the top scorers in Nantwich's 168.

Oakmere v Leigh: Leigh currently sit at the top of the league, although both Nantwich and Lindow could overtake them by winning games in hand. Leigh made it five wins from six completed matches here by restricting Oakmere to 139. After a good start at 96-2 (Leah Holland 42), Oakmere's middle and lower order folded to the bowling of Sophie Heaton, whose 6-14 return is the best in the division this year. After the loss of an early wicket in reply, Ellie Mason and Kirsten Smith took charge for Leigh to wrap up a nine-wicket win inside 24 overs – Mason hitting nine

fours and a six in a run-a-ball 63, while Smith found the boundary 13 times in her 71-ball knock of 64.

Appleton v Didsbury: Didsbury got back to winning ways here, even though their powerful batting line-up is still not firing on all cylinders. They needed Zoe Coombes' 31 to rescue them from 25-5 and eventually reach 103. Marianne Lea and Anni Rashid each finished the innings with four wickets. There was more batting woe for Appleton though as they folded to 48 after their top order was blown away by Hannah Marshall, who became the third bowler in the match to take four wickets.

An updated list of the highest scores in the history of Division 1 – performances from other divisions, or from when the league only had one division, are not shown here. Startlingly, two of the top four were made in a losing cause – as mentioned above, breaking the Didsbury Women club record and making the biggest of her four career centuries was not enough for Roshini Prince-Navaratnam to taste victory last week.

# Division Two - June 23:

<u>Leyland v Greenfield</u>: Leyland are beginning to look formidable at the top of division two and completed another comprehensive win here. Despite Amelia Buckley's 64, Greenfield only posted 132, indeed they were restricted to just 55 in the first 25 overs. Katie Poole's 53 not out and Isobel Cordingley's rapid 40 completed an eight-wicket win.

<u>Hayfield v Buxton</u>: Hayfield recorded their first win here, and in some style as well. Charlotte Peacock took five wickets for seven as a dominant bowling display dismissed Buxton for 52. Ruth Lomas and Sarah McCann then completed the 10-wicket win.

<u>Upton v Hawarden Park</u>: Upton were in good form here for a second win, topping 200 and completing a comfortable 58-run win. On a day when a number of batters made high scores across the league, Charlie Scudder made 90 here. Hawarden remain without a win and had to be consoled here by having taken the maximum bonus points.

Nantwich 2<sup>nd</sup> XI v JG Meakin Northern Stars: Ashlee Prince and Sophie Winward added an unbeaten 85 for the second wicket as Nantwich posted 108-1. Winward then played a significant role as Meakins slumped from 30-0 to 34-4 and ultimately fell 10 runs short.

Alvanley v Chester Boughton Hall 2<sup>nd</sup> XI: Alvanley's winning start continued here with a 25-run win, making 93 in their 20 overs. Shree Dayama returned fine figures of 3-10 for Chester, but the match-winning contributions were made by Alvanley's Sid Shorrock (38 not out) and Ellie Wright (3-12).

### **June 18:**

Alvanley v Appleton 2<sup>nd</sup> XI: Alvanley maintained their 100 per cent record, eventually winning with five overs to spare, as a good partnership between Isla Entwistle and Charlie Barratt saw them to their target of 94. Barratt's 3-12 was also the standout bowling performance in an Appleton innings dominated by Amy Seddon's 46.

Didsbury may have feared the worst when Lindow reached 65-1 in eight overs via the efforts of Holly Topp and Heidi Cheadle, but they were soon pegged back to 73-5. A big finish from Grace Hemsted and Libby Ackerley took the Wilmslow club to 137 in 20 overs. Hannah Marshall and Rosie Ackerley came together at 72-4 in reply and gradually accelerated their side's scoring rate, with overs 16 and 17 collectively adding 25 to the score. Another 14 were needed off the final over, but despite two more boundaries, Didsbury fell just short. In this run spree, there were still moments for bowlers to be proud of, such as Zara Matthews' double-wicket maiden to start Lindow's mini-slump, and Katie Farmer's spell of 2-12 in three overs in the second innings.
