CHESHIRE WOMEN'S LEAGUE

Division One - June 30:

Appleton v Lindow: Appleton made their highest score to date of their difficult season, but still fell well short of stopping Lindow's unbeaten run. Abbey Gore's 26 not out was the top score for the home side, but after their large opening stand the previous week, Heidi Cheadle and Holly Topp were on top form again. The Wilmslow club's opening pair started slowly, then accelerated rapidly to chase down 130 in 17.1 overs, with Topp dismissed just before the close for 50 from 49 balls, with eight fours; and Cheadle ending unbeaten after a dominant 76 from 55 balls with eight fours and five sixes.

Stockport Georgians v Leigh: Another powerful display from Leigh and from Ellie Mason in particular, as she finished with a flurry of boundaries to reach 73 not out in her side's successful chase of 100 for one. Sophie Heaton earlier produced another fantastic spell, taking five wickets for four runs, suggesting a few league bowling records could be under threat this year.

<u>Chester Boughton Hall v Oakmere</u>: Chester have been involved in a few high scoring games of late, but this wasn't one of them, being beaten by Oakmere by eight wickets. The home side mustered just 74 here, with Becky Jones returning fine figures of 3-8 in eight overs for Oakmere.

July 7:

Stockport Georgians v Didsbury: Georgians again struggled with the bat, all out for 74 as Hannah Marshall, Rosie Ackerley and Roshini Prince-Navaratnam all took wickets and were highly economical. The Stockport club though very nearly pulled this one out of the bag, as Didsbury slipped from 46-3 to 52-7 as Liv Bell and Alexis Batey bowled highly effectively in tandem. Finally, they produced a partnership of note as Kashmira Shinde and Emily Wilkins took them all the way to 74 (scores level) before the eighth wicket fell. Shinde finished 34 not out in this two-wicket win – the only double figure score of the second innings.

Division Two - June 30:

<u>Buxton v Leyland</u>: Leyland are halfway through their matches with a 100 per cent record, and so are halfway to the title. This latest decisive win saw Buxton bowled out for 89 and Leyland completing an eight-wicket win.

<u>Hawarden Park v Hayfield</u>: A welcome first win for Hawarden, as they now join both Hayfield and Buxton on one win each in the lower half of the table. 153 for 1 (35) Laura Nicholls (46) and Nicola Deane (42 not out) added 108 for the first wicket on the way to a final total of 153-1.
