

THE 2025 WEEK 8 REVIEW

Week 8 was a trying one for players, officials and spectators alike, autumnal conditions meaning almost every game in Cheshire was interrupted, truncated, abandoned or cancelled.

Leaders Didsbury lost for the first tine this season in an astonishing finish in stygian gloom at Wilmslow Rd. Asked to bat by second place Timperley, Dids made a rain-interrupted 150, which

from 55-7 was a creditable but still disappointing effort, although had Abhay Tipnis (67) not been dropped by skipper Ed Galley when 28 (which would have made the score 65-8) it could have been way worse for Dids. Timperley were left with 24 overs to bat and with three overs to go, in fading light and approaching 7.45pm, they were 112-6, skipper Galley scratching around for 13^* off 16 at that point, Timpers needing 39 off 18 balls. Dids then turned from spin to pace which proved fatal for them, as Galley well and truly redeemed himself, climbing into the bowling with barely believable timing, his scoring sequence in the over reading 6-4-6-6-nb+4-nb+6-6. 40 runs off an over that contained only 5 legitimate balls meant the exhilarated Timpers team had pulled off an amazing win from nowhere, closing the gap on Dids to 11 pts.

It was equally astonishing up at Hyde, but a very different sort of game, as the available George Balderson combined with Andrew Jackson to decimate the Chester BH batting, each taking 5 wkts as CBH were skittled for just 66. With the game reduced to 96 overs it was a good toss to win for skipper Tom Partridge but the bowlers (and fielders) backed the decision totally as Hyde raced to an emphatic 9 wkt win and spared themselves any further weather frustrations. Oxton moved back to fourth despite the best efforts of Alderley Edge's Arav Shetty at Townfield Lane. A rain-affected encounter saw AE reach 203-4 in their 39 overs, Shetty (108*) making a super second ton of the season. He went on to take 4-41 but a brilliant stand of 154 between Jack Breheny (67) and Jack Corran (78) meant Oxton, with 37 overs to chase, had enough wkts in hand to survive a collapse from 183-3 to 194-7, winning by 2 wkts with 3 balls to spare.

Three fifties and a 46 from the Brooklands top four gave them a solid 240-5 in 52 overs against Neston, the visitors disappointed to provide so little resistance as they were undone by the miserly Brooklands attack, all out 111. Nantwich welcomed back Rob Jones for a second innings of the season, the result another century, Jones making 149* off 110 balls in a treat for the spectators braving the conditions, Nantwich declaring on 252-4 as bottom side Widnes cursed their luck running into a full strength side who bowled them out for 151. Bowdon were also frustrated having reached 234-7 in 40 overs at Lindow, Joe Chapple (51) and John Sanders (53) hitting 11 sixes between them before rain ended it.



SHIRE COUNTY

The meeting of top v bottom in Div 1 saw leaders Cheadle wrap up another 20 pts after Josh Dooler again had a fine match. Dooler claimed 4-14, with three wkts apiece for Will Holmes and Ash Burton as Grappen-

hall fell to bits, 125-4 becoming 136 all out ten overs later. Aryan Ashish (4-48) did at least put the wind up the Cheadle top order, but from 54-4 it became plain sailing as Dan Brown (62*) and Dooler (35*) added the 83 needed. Bramhall kept up their pursuit after a penurious game at Moorside Rd, Bramhall labouring to 122 in 41 overs before dismissing Urmston for just 80, Olly Latter (5-9) and Simon Wilkinson (3-10) inducing an Urmies collapse from 53-2. No actual sunlight at Port Sunlight but plenty of daylight between the hosts and visitors Maritime, PS skipper Simon Melberzs hitting a magnificent 101* (68 bs) as from 73-4 his side piled up 272-5 in their 43 os, Melberzs then taking 2 wkts as Maritime had no answers, 177 all out. Macclesfield's Joe Moores (55*) was a class apart with the bat on a tricky track at Davenham, securing a 7 wkt win for his side which kept Davenham in trouble. Stockport Georgians thus chose a very good day to win, their impressive 6 wkt victory over Toft a real team effort aided by Toft having a shocker with the ball, 24 wides conceded in a total of 36 extras. A rain-affected match at Dane Rd saw Marple produce a great fightback as Sale reached 101-1, needing 76 off 11 overs but ending on 155-8, Marple triumphant by 21 runs.

In Div 2, after almost chasing a monster score against Prem opponents in the T20, it was back down to earth with a crash for Ashley, skittled for just 47 at Alvanley, Corey McCarthy taking 5-7 as the league leaders made it eight wins from eight. That kept Alv ahead of chasing Bollington, who reached their DLS target of 158 in just 22.3 os at Ashton OM, the Yaksender (89*)/Gibson (47*) axis again proving its worth as the pair added an unbroken 101 for an 8 wkt win. Ben Stoddard's 88* for Christleton proved crucial on their trip to NE Cheshire, the hosts set a DLS target of 201 from 30 overs as a result, Christleton keeping things in check – just – to win by 18 runs. Naveed Gondal made 88* from 92 bs as his side beat Oulton Park by 3 wkts in an 88 over game, while Cheadle Hulme got a much needed 20 pts after their bowlers made life tough for struggling Haslington, who were restricted to 138-8 in their 36 overs. After more rain, CH needed 96 off 20 os, winning by 7 wkts. Surprisingly no play at all was possible at Upton, their match with Romiley cancelled.

In Div 3, Heaton Mersey beat the rain and lowly Over Peover quite comfortably to stay top, an 8 wkt win achieved after an unbroken stand of 85 for the 3rd wkt got them to their DLS target of 106, while Warrington kept up their pursuit with an equally pleasing win over mercurial Mobberley, whose batting simply fell to bits within ten overs, 74-3 tuning into 88 all out. James Rudd recorded 6-3-7-4 as Warrington won by 6 wkts. Oakmere's impressive 227-8 in their 47 overs at Tattenhall proved not enough, as Tatt's DLS target of 186 in 31 overs was reached in an exciting finish with just three balls to spare, Corey Bovey's great form reaching new heights as he made a brilliant 97* (101 bs). Barrow also kept their good results going with a DLS-adjusted win at Middlewich, while Runcorn skipper Kieran Maher led his side by example at Winnington Park. The rain proved no obstacle on a cheerless day as Maher, having taken 4-44 in WP's 94 all out, hammered 45 off 17 bs to seal Runcorn's first league win of the campaign, moving them within range of the other strugglers. Hawk Green v Hale Barns was cancelled.

WEEK 8 2ND & 3RD XI CRICKET

2ND XI CRICKET: A late charge by Didsbury's 6th wkt pair got them upto 180-5 in 70 over game at basement side Timperley, who collapsed to 59 all out in reply as Ed Catt took 5-20. Toft stayed second despite losing a thriller to Brooklands in a game reduced to 84 overs, Brooklands digging in from 139-8 to reach

178-9 and a 1 wkt win. Mike Stewart took 5-21 for Neston but it was in vain as visitors Oxton's 153 proved more than enough, Neston 106 all out in reply. Cheadle's William Clift was another with 5 wkts, his 5-24 seeing Hyde shot out for 92, Cheadle winning by 9 wkts as skipper Moin Shah made 60. Joe McCurdy was left stranded on 93* as Widnes tumbled from 213-6 to 225 all out but it was still more than enough to see off Stockport Georgians, who were all out 127 in reply. Chester BH's game with Nantwich at Filkins Lane was cancelled.

Div 1 was badly affected by the weather, only 2 matches completed. One of those games saw Alvanley bag a handy 20 pts after they skittled Didsbury 2As at Mere for just 63, although Alv sportingly made a game of it by stuttering to 32-5 in reply before getting the job done with no further losses. The only other completed game typified how it goes when things are tough, bottom club Grappenhall getting a game in over at Maritime but going down to a 9 wkt loss for their troubles, Maritime knocking off the 100 needed in under 16 overs. Elsewhere, H.Mersey batted for 8.4 os at Bramhall before that was that, likewise Marple for 18 os at home to Sale and Macc for just 4 overs at home to Lindow. They couldn't even get started at South Downs Lane as Bowdon v Upton was cancelled.

In Div 2 P.Sunlight's Ben Slight made 68* off 53 bs to speed his side to a rain-adjusted 8 wkt victory at struggling Oulton Park and keep them top, as Alderley Edge also won, recording a 6 wkt win over 3rd place Urmston. The other side in the bottom two, Warrington, went down at Romiley by 41 runs, while Haslington won a second successive game by 9 runs, holding off Oakmere.

In Div 3 it was a bleak scene with only two matches completed. Davenham's decision to field at leaders Ashley backfired as the hosts made 195 in 49.5 os, Kaleem Malik then taking 7-30 as Davenham were bundled out for just 78. N.E.Cheshire went second after winning a 48 over game at Oxton, NEC reaching their 145 target with almost 3 overs to spare to win by 6 wkts.

Sunday 3rd XI News Prem leaders Brooklands lost a league game for the first time this season, Ashley's Mohammed Kamran making 94 in his side's 243-6. Despite another fine inns from the prolific Sam Hill (85, to go with 82 and 92 in his prev. two knocks) Brooklands lost by 31 runs. Sale and Didsbury both won to close the gap, Sale winning a tense low-scoring game against Georgians while Dids won comfortably at Marple. Toft's David Blackburn made 102* as his side racked up 264-1 against Nantwich, who conceded 60 extras and then went on to be bowled out for 60, while it was even more buttock-clenching for Grappenhall supporters, their side thrashed all over the place by Santhosh Gopalakrishnan who made a remarkable 164 off 88 bs (11x6, 11x4) for Timperley, their 368-4 a new record total for the Prem in its 40 over format. Grappers understandably got nowhere near after such a chastening experience but showed some resolve in batting almost 38 overs to make 154. In Div 1 Hyde kept their perfect start going while Trafford Metrovicks won to maintain their Div 2 lead.

1st XI T20 GROUP STAGE (1st XI T20 holders = OXTON)

Matchday 1 - Thursday June 5th was badly affected by rain - some matches may be re-arranged - but one extraordinary game set the benchmark for the T20 'match of the season'.

Gp 1: Oxton v Upton and **Port Sunlight v Chester BH** were both rained off.

Gp 2: Neston (163-4, 18 os) beat Maritime (158-7, 18 os) by 5 runs David Hurst (50 off 40) and Matt Maritz (47 off 30) gave Neston a respectable total at Bromborough Pool but Neston were pushed all the way as Sawan Kankanage (81 off 52) and Vensakar Kanthiraj (30 off 25) added 86 in 9 overs. But Matt Stewart (3-31) bowled a tight last over, dismissing Kankanage as Maritime found the 15 they needed just out of reach.

Widnes (117-3, 12 os) beat Oulton Park (80-8, 12 os) by 37 runs A match played in difficult conditions was suspended after just one ball, with sufficient time left for a minimum game. All the Widnes batsmen got into double figures and their bowlers had too much for their Div 2 opponents, Louis Burns (4-14) the pick.

Gp 3: Toft (141-9, 20 os) beat Nantwich (109, 19.3 os). Played on Tuesday, Toft's Dan Ward took 24 off the final two overs which proved decisive in an impressive Toft display, Ward taking the final wicket as Nantwich rarely looked likely to chase their required target. **Bowdon v Haslington** was rained off on Thursday.

Gp 4: Alderley Edge (110-1) beat Hawk Green (109) by 9 wkts (no details available) Marple v Brooklands was rained off and has been rearranged for Weds 18th.

Gp 5: Hyde v NE Cheshire *and* **Macclesfield v Sale** were both rained off.

Gp 6: Bramhall (69-2, 9.1) beat Stockport Georgians (83) by 35 runs (DLS): Lachlan Anson's 4-17 was the pick of a tight Bramhall bowling performance, Bramhall miles ahead on DLS when rain brought the match to a halt. **Timperley v Cheadle Hulme** was rained off.

Gp 7: Davenham (125-4, 15 os) bt Grappenhall (133-2, 17 os) by 3 runs (DLS) The two Div 1 strugglers made a decent fist of it in difficult conditions, Davenham just keeping their noses ahead of the DLS par when the rain proved terminal, Martyn East's 41 off 25 bs proving decisive.

Lindow (226-2, 18 os) beat Ashley (183-6, 18 os) by 43 runs

A phenomenal display* from Lindow all-rounder Dan Newton was the centrepiece of an incredible game of cricket at Upcast Lane. In a match reduced to 36 overs, Newton blasted 153* from 56 balls, with 15x6 and 10x4, and with James Duffy (52*) added 205* for the 3rd wkt in 15 overs as Lindow piled up 226-2, scoring at 18 r.p.o. for the second half of their innings, including a sequence of 91 runs coming in 4 overs. Far from being fazed, Ashley came out all guns blazing, the talents of Ammad Mushtaq again to the fore as they raced to 118-1 in their first 9 overs. Mushtaq was striking as sublimely as the Lindow pair had as, incredibly, Ashley were 19 ahead of the DLS par in the 11th over! Then, much to the hosts' relief with rain in the air, Mushtaq was caught behind for a superb 91 off just 35 balls, Lindow finally able to gain control, running out winners by 43 runs in a wonderful match which yielded 409 at an average run rate of 11.36 r.p.o.

(*Newton's innings was the third highest in CCCL 1st T20 history, his 15 sixes equalling the record for an innings. His strike rate of 273.21 is a 1st XI T20 record for an inns facing 50 balls or more. Lindow's total is the 12th highest in 1st XI T20 CCCL history, the double century partnership the fourth such in the competition).

Gp 8: Urmston 98-7 (20 os) v Cheadle - match abandoned. *Urmston escaped with a point as the hosts were frustrated by the weather.*

Didsbury v Heaton Mersey had already been re-arranged for Weds 18th June.

2ND XI T20

With matches played across the week, the 2nd XI T20 Cup got underway on Monday. Holders Chester BH 2s will start their defence in the next round.

Mon 2: Marple (76-5, 18 os) beat Ashton OM (75, 18.4 os) by 5 wkts Marple slid to 46-5 in their chase of a disappointing AOM total but had time to dig themselves out of a hole.

Tues 3: Romiley (96-5, 15 os) beat Urmston (96-4, 15 os) by 3 runs (DLS) Urmston needed 13 off the last on a rain-affected evening, Chris Turner's 4-11 and 25 in vain for Urmston.

Winnington Park (145-6, 20 os) beat Oakmere (94, 16.1 os) by 51 runs WP's Matt Atherton & Alex Unwin took 6-13 between them as Oakmere fell apart from being 81-2.

Cheadle Hulme (126-3, 13.1 os) beat Hale Barns (123, 17 os) by 7 wkts Adil Khan smashed 86* off 41 bs to ease Cheadle Hulme into the next round.

Chester BH 3s (209-4, 19 os) beat Port Sunlight (67-5, 9.4 os) by 49 runs (DLS) CBH's Marius Mostert hit a superb 100 as his side won through comfortably in a truncated game.

Timperley 3s (122, 19.4 os) beat Ashley (119-9, 20 os) by 3 runs (DLS) *In a tense finish, Ashley needed 15 off the last over, Timpers just holding on.*

Maritime (80-0, 7.5 os) beat Tattenhall (78-7, 14 os) by 10 wkts Bilal Anwar slammed a rapid 51* as Maritime won with a minimum of fuss.

Heaton Mersey (102-4, 15.4 os) beat Stockport (101, 18.3 os) by 6 wkts HM skipper Shabaz Shafiq returned 5-25 as his side won through with plenty to spare.

Weds 4: Haslington (144-5, 20 os) beat Warrington (135-8, 20 os) by 9 runs Captain Oliver Williams made 67 as Haslington posted a challenging total, Joe Cork then taking a late hattrick as Warrington were kept in check.

3RD XI T20 QUARTER-FINALS

After repeated requests over the years, 3rd XI QFs were finally played at a more amenable time of the year. Three matches took place on Tuesday, with two clubs set to make their first appearance at Finals Day.

Didsbury 167-9 (19 os) beat Brooklands 132-9 (19 os) by 40 runs.

A disastrous Brooklands fielding display proved very costly as they dropped seven catches, including Madhukar Mekhala (61 off 35) first ball of the match. Mekhala and Mike Corbett added 95 in 8 overs before a calamitous run out (which has had a number of views on TikTok) brought the Didsbury momentum to a bit of a halt, but their final total was to prove more than enough, Mekhala taking three wkts in three balls (including a stumping off a wide) which sparked a debate about whether or not this could be classed as a hat-trick! Regardless, the Cup Holders won through to an eighth successive Finals Day.

Toft 136-5 (16.1 os) beat Grappenhall 131-5 (20 os) by 5 wkts.

Grappers worked hard for their total, and then had Toft 10-2 after 3 os of their reply, but Noah Wasilewski underlined his credentials with 63 off just 38 bs, George Muirhead delighting the club chairman by smashing a six to seal a first ever spot for Toft at Finals Day.

Marple/Compstall 146-5 (20 os) beat Stockport Georgians 143-7 (20 os) by 3 runs.

Georgians were left to rue their indiscipline with the ball, conceding 38 extras (incl. 29 wides) as M/C ran up a challenging total, George Bailey (37) and Cameron Reid (34) adding 71 in 10 os together. Bailey then dismissed opener Sajjad Ayub first ball, but the SG total was already 20, thanks to Saj Hussain (42 off 13 bs) who countered in typical style. Finn Raynes (37) kept the chase alive but with 12 needed off the last in growing tension, M/C did just enough to reach their first Finals Day.

CHESHIRE CUP ROUND 2

A full programme of games took place on a distinctly autumnal Sunday, but there were a number of notable performances in a full programme, which saw three Premier Division sides knocked out.

KINGSWAY: CHEADLE 129-8 (40 os) beat BIRKENHEAD PARK 60 (25.3 os) by 69 runs

The unbroken 9th wkt stand between Cheadle keeper Dan Osbourne and Ben Broadhurst, which added 42 and occupied 12 overs, at least gave Cheadle something to defend, and they did so in remarkable style after BP, having reached 22-0 in 4.4 os, collapsed in a heap, mesmerised by the spin of skipper Josh Dooler, who finished with 7.3-5-3-5.

BOOTHS PARK: ALDERLEY EDGE 206-2 (21.3 os) beat TOFT 202-6 (26 os) by 8 wkts. A rain-shortened game produced some incredible batting, Toft's Henry Hughes hitting 102 (68 bs) as his side compiled a sizeable score. But AE, despite losing Sam Perry for 0, went about their chase in spectacular style as Chris Sanders (84* off 38 bs, incl. 8x6) and former Toft player Gennaro Reddy (67* off 52 bs) added 140* in just under 12 overs.

BUTCHER'S STILE: DIDSBURY 204 (36.2 os) beat DAVENHAM 139 (31.4 os) by 57 runs (DLS) A 37 overs per side match saw the cup holders safely through, Tim Hughes' 79 the centrepiece of their total after being put in. After a slow start Davenham briefly hinted at an upset, with more rain in the air and catching up to the DLS par, but the loss of skipper Sam Hunt proved the key moment.

LONDON RD: ELWORTH 227-6 (40 os) beat OXTON 131 (33.5 os) by 96 runs Last season's semi-finalists despatched their Premier Division opponents with ease, captain Alex Banks (91) leading the way as Oxton never got going in their reply, 50-4 after 16 os with the writing on the wall.

CHURCH LANE (RCCG): BRAMHALL 156-9 (40 os) beat NANTWICH 118 (34.2 os) by 38 runs Arguably the result of the round as the 1st Division outfit defeated the Premier Division side, who have a strong record in the competition. Jack Clark's 69 held the Bramhall batting together as Jason Foulkes took 5-27 but Lachlan Anson's electrifying spell (4-17) saw the Dabbers 43-4 after 11 and Bramhall never let it slip on a memorable day.

VICTORIA RD: CHESTER BH 169-2 (31.5 os) beat MACCLESFIELD 167 (39.2 os) by 8 wkts Chester put their mixed league form behind them with a comprehensive win, six of their seven bowlers used taking wkts as no Macc batsman reached 50. Alex Money (86) and Josh Hollinshead (41) then put on 115 for the 1st which effectively settled the contest.
