



## Heidi Cheadle breaks Division 1 record again, while overall record hangs by a thread

### [Lindow 284-3, Oakmere 126](#)

Just three weeks after making 187 not out for Lindow, Heidi Cheadle went three runs better to break her own record for the highest score in Division 1 history. The fourth and fifth balls of the final over both went for six to take her to the new Division 1 record, but when there was just a single from the final ball, it meant that the overall league individual score record – which stands at 191, from a time when the league comprised a single division – remains intact for now. With Cheadle having gone close twice and Leigh's Danielle Collins having also come within 20 runs of this mark so far in 2026, Jenny Halstead's 21-year-old landmark score is really hanging by a thread!

When Cheadle reached 50 today with little more than a third of the overs completed, many of those present suspected something special might be on the cards. The final score of 190 not out from 133 balls, with 19 fours and eight sixes, certainly falls into that category.

Oakmere's Thisumi Jayawarna took two wickets in two balls with the score on 34, but there was little more to cheer for the Northwich club, as Cheadle added 180 for the third wicket with Carys White.

Kerry Hartnett's 26 was the top score for Oakmere in reply. After a decent start at 56-1, Oakmere struggled thereafter as Lindow's Amy Seddon (5-20) and Faye Smith (3-25) exerted control.

### Division One – June 14:

[Stockport Georgians 241-3, Leigh 108](#): Georgians are still top of the table, even if Leyland and Didsbury are close behind, and Lindow could go top by winning the game in hand. The Stockport club were another side in fine form today, as Skye Thomas and Ellie Mason added 196 in 31 overs for the first wicket. Mason eventually fell for 82 from 97 balls, with 13 fours, but Thomas remained undefeated on 105, made from 98 balls, with 17 fours. Leigh were always facing a tough chase, but things got even harder when Beth Tittensor's first hat-trick in senior cricket reduced them to 47-5. Aimee Latham's 63 completely dominated the second innings scorecard as Tittensor finished with 4-21 and Neve Boon 3-21.

[Didsbury 229-4, Northop Hall 102](#): A third Division one club making a big score when batting first today was Didsbury, and they also had a centurion. Roshini Prince-Navaratnam bagged her second ton of the year, with a score of 139 not out from 122 balls with 18 fours. Promoted Northop Hall are still without a league win, and they were soon losing wickets here, as Didsbury's Hannah Marshall opened her spell with a double wicket maiden.

[Chester Boughton Hall 128-7, Leyland 129-1](#): Leyland's good start continued as they controlled this match, meaning that all four of today's first division encounters were somewhat one sided. Here, the dominant batting came in the second innings – Olivia Cunliffe's 86 from 70 balls, with 15 fours and one six ensuring the chase was completed inside 20 overs. Earlier, Isla Simpson had produced another fine opening spell to put Boughton Hall on the back foot, and from 67-5 and 96-7, they limped to a final target of little more than three per over.

### Division Two – June 14:

[Nantwich 86, Hayfield 88-8](#): The top two teams – both with 100 per cent records before today – met here, and it was Hayfield who grabbed the spoils in a low scoring contest. Bo Singleton was Hayfield's bowling star with 5-13. Beth Hughes (3-13) and Morganne Prince (2-9) did their best to defend the low target, and Hayfield did slip from 82-4 to 85-8, but they eventually sneaked over the line. The High Peak club's top scorer was C Fairclough with 38 and she was the only player on either side to pass 13, with Hayfield's Alice Dyson finally being dismissed for the first time this season today.

[Alvanley 280-5, Didsbury 2<sup>nd</sup> XI 200-7](#): Isla Entwistle was today's fourth centurion, to add to the three in the top division, and her landmark innings today rescued her Alvanley side from 5-3 and from 48-4 to record an imposing final total. Entwistle finished unbeaten on 133, from 124 balls, as she added 196 for the fifth wicket with Charlie Barratt, who made 86 from as many balls. Zoe Rigley, Abby Nicholson and Eleanor Brennan all reached the 40s for Didsbury, but overhauling this target was always a huge ask. Barratt contributed a spell of 3-31 to add to her earlier runs.

[Greenfield 202-6, Upton 203-8](#): Bottom placed Greenfield are still without a win, although they must have been fairly confident at the halfway mark, after Helen Smith had made 79 and Alanya Thorpe 61. Lily Scudder and Cath Williams added 116 for the first wicket in reply, however, and although regular wickets then began to fall, Scudder remained unbeaten on 88 to see Upton home with a ball to spare. Zoe Cuthill's spell of 5-29 this proved to be in vain for Greenfield.

### Division Three East – June 14:

[North East Cheshire 55, Whalley Range 56-7](#): Whalley Range maintained their unbeaten league record, but this was perhaps the closest they have so far come to defeat since joining the league last year. It all seemed to be going to plan for the South Manchester side when North East were bundled out for 55 (Hannah Price 4-17), but Whalley Range soon found themselves 25-6 in reply, with Sian Avery-Lofthouse recording the remarkable figures of 5-3 in four overs. Nida Bano's 18 not out was the crucial contribution for Whalley Range to get them to the target.

[Macclesfield 96-9, Buxton 97-4](#): Macclesfield tasted defeat for the first time this year. Bethany Johnson's 29 not out was their only double figure score as they failed to reach three figures. After losing three early wickets in reply, Buxton were guided home by Isla Stewart (41) and Alice-Olivia Tremble (36\*).

[Heaton Mersey & Cheadle 130-8, New Mills & High Peak North 131-8](#): Jane Hynes made 53 to guide Heaton Mersey & Cheadle to a healthy total, with Rachel Monteath taking 4-18 for New Mills in the first innings. New Mills slipped to 81-8 in reply, but had Annie Bate and Josie Stone on hand to contribute 50 for the ninth wicket and see them to a dramatic win.

### Division Four West – June 14:

[Kingsley 131-3, Oxton 72](#): Kingsley made it five wins from five, with Nicole Lloyd and Tarryn Warman both reaching 30 retired. Although Oxton's Molly Price took 3-10, the final total looked an imposing one, and a spell of 4-11 from Darcey Williamson duly completed the win.

[Crewe 121-5, Aston 40](#): Crewe also won convincingly and stand firmly in second place. Chloe Manock and Ailsa Meakin with the bat (both making 30 retired) and Amy Bourne with the ball, were their star performers here.

### Division Four South East – June 14:

[Romiley 85-6, Lindow 3<sup>rd</sup> XI 87-1](#): Romiley fell to a first defeat since promotion to Division 4. Georgina Park's 2-5 was the standout bowling performance, before 30 from Pippa Allen and 26 from Sara Bracken saw the Wilmslow club to victory.

[Didsbury 128-6, Oakmere 126-6](#): Holders Didsbury started their defence of this trophy by getting through a nailbiting clash at Oakmere. The match started with some tight overs from Sarah Worsdale and Thisumi Jayawarna, and although a score of 40 followed from Roshini Prince-Navaratnam, with Emily Wilkins adding 32, the run rate never got much above one per ball, leaving the target very much within reach. Indeed Oakmere were in the box seat during the chase at 85-1, opener Phoebe Cottam making 48, but from 94-4, it was always looking more of an uphill task.

[Chester Boughton Hall 143-6, Stockport Georgians 126](#): In this match between two teams who won their first game in this competition, Chester secured the potentially vital win. They were going very well indeed when Carys Lambe and Georgia Munro fired them to 91-1 after 11 overs. Although the likes of Bethany Evans (2-15) then applied the brake for Georgians, the final total was more than enough to create some scoreboard pressure. Gaby McKeever hit 26 from 15 balls at the start of the reply, but Georgians began to fall behind the required rate after she was dismissed. Although Evans remained unbeaten for a run-a-ball 40, the likes of Ffion Jones and Diya Dayama did the job with the ball for Chester.
