



THE 2026 WEEK 15 REVIEW - PREMIER DIV

The penultimate week of WLD cricket in the Prem was dominated by Oxton and in particular overseas star Timothy Crawford, while on Sunday Lindow were crowned 1st XI T20 champions after an absorbing Finals Day at Upcast Lane.

After a dramatic week 14 in the **Premier Division** saw three sides tied at the top, week 15 saw Oxton grab all the headlines as they broke two league records at Alderley Edge.

That was largely thanks to overseas player Timothy Crawford, whose productive season soared to amazing new heights as he smashed a glorious 229 at Moss Lane, breaking a league record that has stood for more than two decades. Having bagged a duck last week, Crawford took guard in the fifth over with his side 24-2, and, given a life on 60, proceeded to dominate with an array of superb strokes, reaching his 200 with his ninth six (breaking the Prem high score record in the process). A 29th four then took him past the record 1st XI individual score, Andrej Yaksender's record 224 lasting just two weeks! Oxton declared after 49 os on an exhilarating 423-6, the highest ever 1st XI total in Prem history and joint-highest in CCCL history (Maritime made 423-5 in 2025).

After a terrible start to their reply AE managed to dig in, 61 from Will Valentine inspiring lower-order resistance from recent Toft acquisition Rohan Aggarwal (68*) and Max Otway (49*), the ninth-wkt pair batting for 12 os as they added an unbroken 77 to draw the game. Oxton's 14 pts at least moved them a little further away from the drop zone as the three sides below them all lost, and although Alderley Edge still have some breathing space, they are now without a win in nine matches, facing rock-bottom Brooklands next, who also badly need a win.

Brooklands were overpowered by a strong Didsbury performance, the champions posting 345 (Tom Hafil 85, Rob Sehmi 67, Steve Green 51) after their shock collapse last week saw them lose top spot. Brooklands, who are now 65 pts adrift, are in serious trouble, Green's spin returning 6-39 as Dids rushed to a massive 179 run victory, but that was the bare minimum for them as Hyde and Nantwich both marched relentlessly on with their sixth and seventh successive wins respectively.

Hyde are top on matches won, following up last week's hard-fought and ultimately narrow win over struggling Neston with an absolute demolition job on Chester BH, charging to a thumping 10 wkt victory at Filkins Lane in a match that lasted just 55 overs. Luke Young was the Hyde star, taking 5-15 before making 56*, he and Rian Maisuria (43*) putting on 101* (cont.)

as Hyde brutally snuffed out CBH's hitherto impressive run of form. Last weeks astonishing 57-run win at Didsbury defending just 134 saw Jack Williams' side make it three straight wins and seven matches unbeaten (having been without key man Alex Money since May 30th) - overseas player Ben Giddy's splendid 8-48 the best 1st XI bowling figures this season - making Saturday's collapse a real disappointment. CBH didn't get a single point, but that good run of form has given them a decent cushion from any trouble.

Nantwich are the form side and are in a fantastic run that has seen them progress in both 1st XI Cup competitions as well as their league standing. They last tasted defeat in the league on May 23rd, drawing the two games after that but then, wins all the way. They shrugged off the rarity of a duck for skipper Luke Robinson at Timperley to get to 284-7 having been 100-4, Spencer Byatt making a super 101* (89 bs) with Jake Pearson (59) providing the most of much useful support. Timpers then ran into the remorseless Nantwich attack, Scott Wardley's spin claiming 4-38 and Ray Doyle (second highest league wkt taker this season) 3-48 as the hosts were bowled out for 182.

What a peculiar season Timperley are experiencing! That defeat was their third in four games, and with only three wins in their 10 WLD matches to date - despite passing 300 three times and making 299-8 and 271-9 - they are stuck in the lower half. Their draw last week at Lindow is a strong contender for match of the season - Dan Scholz making a stunning 162 and adding 183 for the 6th with Zac Thompson (83) as they pursued an unlikely 372 for victory, finishing on 328-9 after the last man defended five balls. Earlier Dan Newton had made a brilliant 150 (149 bs) as he and skipper Alex Matthews (95) put on the second of two 150 partnerships in the same innings!

Lindow were not to be denied on Saturday, however, but they had to fight every step of the way for the win at Parkgate after hosts Neston again suffered a narrow reverse. The hosts were teetering on 87-6 but a sterling recovery saw them make 236, no.10 Harry Donelan making 47* and adding 73 for the last wkt with skipper Matt Stewart. Despite 70 from Rob Herriott Lindow were in real trouble at 177-6 but it was that man Matthews again to the rescue, his 55* (54 bs) inching his side to a 2 wkt win which left them fourth. With 501 runs and 51 wkts in all competitions, he is the division's outstanding all-rounder.

The two sides promoted last season played out a tense draw at Church Lane as hosts Bramhall just held off Josh Dooler's Cheadle, Dooler himself having one ball at last man Simon Wilkinson to try and get the win after stubborn resistance from the tail. Earlier Subhaan Mahmood's determined 69, with useful contributions from James Clift (44) and Dan Brown (36) got Cheadle to 225, Bramhall slipping back down to 11th as a result of their 182-9 in reply. That made it four successive draws for Cheadle, but they have had an encouraging 2026 and sit proudly in fifth.

In **Division 1** Widnes went back to the top after a ruthless disassembling of struggling Urmston, for whom games are running out fast. Having been put in, Matt Burns made an excellent 102 (110 bs), and Sean Bennett hammered 70 off 57 as all the Widnes top 7 got healthy scores. Allied with 37 extras, their 341-7 was always going to be miles too many, and as Urmston collapsed to 91-8 it looked like being a thoroughly painful trip. No.10 Istiqal Hanif at least went down all guns blazing, a violent 60 off just 23 bs (incl. 7x6) providing late entertainment, but a 172-run defeat was sobering nonetheless - although all is not yet lost for James Bashford's side.

Another side passing 300 were Maritime, Sachin Jacob rattling up 150 off 133 bs - his second ton of the season - as he and Dinoshan Theiven-dram (61 off 37) added 161 for the 5th wkt in the blink of an eye. Bollington, leaders before play started, were the ones on the receiving (cont.)

end for once, and although Rick Hough (75) and Andrej Yaksender (36) opened up with 83 - and indeed, Hough with Cameron Smail (56) taking the score to 176-2 in the 31st - Bolly couldn't keep up with the rate as the varied Maritime attack seized their opportunity, Theivendram taking 4-58 as Bolly totalled a creditable 279 but went down by 38 runs. There's still quite a gap to third spot, however, despite that setback, Toft making up a little bit of ground after a pulsating 7 run win at Bowdon. What a find Connor Hastings has proved to be for Will Dunkerley's side, the Aussie making a fantastic 156* (146 bs, 1x6, 27x4) in Toft's 271-7 at South Downs Rd, his fourth ton of the season. He then chipped in with two wkts as Bowdon - despite the upheaval of three different captains in 2026 - gave it a real go, Joe Chapple making 73 and James Bottomley 65 off 50. In the event, needing 58 off the last 5, Bowdon finished just 7 runs short, and they remain too close to the drop zone for comfort. Marple are another side who face a fidgety run-in after they lost heavily at bottom side Alvanley, who were understandably jubilant after just their second win of the campaign. Despite an impressive 81 from Ieuan Morris, it took an extraordinary 59* (35 bs) from no.10 Charlie Fletcher to really get things going, the youngster then tearing in to take 3-15 as Marple slumped to 131 and a 105-run defeat, Charlie Hodgson retiring n.o. for 65 - the only double figure inns. In the other games two majestic centuries grabbed the headlines - Tyrone Lawrence hit a fabulous 114* as Sale cruised to a 7 wkt win chasing 273 at Port Sunlight, Lawrence and Cam Kwok (71) adding 146 together. At Flowery Field, spectators were treated to a vintage display from Ned Bailey, the Georgians opener fashioning an imperious 176 (144 bs, 10x6, 18x4) as his side soared to 347-6, way too many for Macc to chase as they were all out 231.

A mini-shockwave hit **Division 2** as leaders Upton were inexplicably skittled for 77 at home to NE Cheshire, who headed off with a whopping 198-run win after skipper Danny Williams (65*) and Jake Reynolds (60) had been the main contributors to their 275-7. Young spinner Jack Cook was the toast of the team with a superb 6-24 as Upton lost 9-28 in a stunning collapse. Oulton Park took full advantage with a crushing win of their own, Danny Leach creaming a second ton of the season, his 128 (139 bs) the mainstay of OP's 293-6 against Haslington, skipper Andrew Dufty weighing in with 66. Has replied aggressively with 91 on the board inside 10 os, but they'd lost 5 wkts by that point and their three-match winning streak came to an end shortly after as they were all out 140. Third-place Davenham were aided by a wayward Oakmere attack that donated 46 extras to their 220-9, Jimmy O'Sullivan adding to his handy 39 with 5-33 as Oakmere were bowled out for 159. At the bottom, Grappenhall stayed just out of the drop zone after an 8 wkt win over basement Ashley, Will Fell making 77, while Christleton - after seven successive defeats that sent them plummeting down the table - held on in a remarkable game at Grove Park to beat Cheadle Hulme by 7 runs. Max Duvaband's 72 helped Christleton total 229, Ben Balderson taking 5-23. When CH flopped to 145-8 it seemed like that was that, but no.9 Rob Bone had other ideas, firstly adding 43 with Adeel Raza before a run-out ended things, but Bone (61*) then garnered another 34 with last man Joannas Kumar before Duvaband had him caught as the tension mounted. Max Harper made 100 as, along with 60 from no.8 Ben Ryan, Tattenhall got from 118-6 to an astonishing 284-9 against Romiley, who, despite a brilliant 107 (101 bs) from skipper Alex Hooton, finished on 241-7.

It's realistically five teams in **Division 3** that are contending for the two promotion places, leaders Ashton OM looking well on course for an immediate return to Div 2 after a comprehensive twelfth win of the campaign, by 9 wkts at Stockport. Opener Charlie Erasmus hit an astonishing 20x4 in his 99*, the last one of those off a no-ball to win the match, having taken 3-39 earlier. Heaton Mersey stay in second after a truly extraordinary display at Runcorn by their no.11 Omed Bashir, who hit 10x6 and 7x4 in a 55-ball 95, HM rocketing from 93-9 to 212. His bowling suffered as a result, however, bowling 14 wides in 8 overs as a stunned Runcorn nonetheless rallied, needing 43 off 11 overs with 5 wkts in hand, but the collywobbles set in and they were bowled out for 193. Matt Spells continued his good form for Hale Barns with 75, but it was Connor Robson's 40-ball 94 that really stole the show for HB as they reached 246 at Barrow, who they dismissed for 212, thankful that the 40 wides they bowled weren't more costly. Winnington Park shrugged off last week's loss - and losing skipper Joe Stimpson to the first ball of the match - as Sam Barnes smote a superb 137* (144 bs) in their 271-7 against Middlewich, who replied with 173, which left them 61 pts from safety. Mobberley are even further back, an eleventh loss of the campaign all the more disheartening after a decent batting effort at Warrington saw them total 252-8, and then reducing the hosts to 207-8. Skipper Liam Jenkins stood firm, however, his 69* encouraging no.10 Eswar Peddi to have a go, his 26* (22 bs) helping seal a 2 wkt win. In the other game Bredbury SM beat Irby by 2 wkts in a low-scoring encounter.

WEEK 15 2ND & 3RD XI CRICKET

2ND XI CRICKET: Successive defeats for leaders Didsbury has reduced their lead at the top of the **Prem** down to 15 pts. Dids were undone by a doughty CBH lower-order last week, before going down by 6 wkts at home by Brooklands, who thus did the double over the champions with two comfortable wins over them in 2026. With their next four games all against struggling sides, Brooklands are far from done in the title race - neither are Chester, Dan Riley's men making it a third successive two-wkt win with an important 20 pts at title rivals Toft, who didn't help themselves by conceding 25 byes amongst 47 extras. CBH face Brooklands at the end of August in what could be a key game, but if Didsbury can stop the rot - which won't be easy given they play Toft next - Ryan Wilson's side will still be the one to catch. Elsewhere Oxton's Craig Mathieson made 84* (53 bs) before a boundary off the final ball took them to 304-6 and a 4 wkt win over neighbours Upton in an amazing match, while Joe Clarke, batting at no.9, made 65 as the last Timperley pair added 59 in arguably the result of the day, struggling Timpers winning by 14 runs at Nantwich despite 118 from Lou Vincent, and Mitchell Spencer in the Dabbers' ranks (he took 5-46). Bottom side Neston knocked off 234 to win by 4 wkts at Lindow, while Max Fisher smashed 118* (77 bs) as he and Rob Basu (91) steered Cheadle to 269-4 and a 104 run over Widnes, Alex Read taking 5-37.

A surprise win for struggling Alvanley at **Div 1** leaders Marple lifted them out of the drop zone, no.10 Sam Mallows whacking 52* and then taking 4-28, Alv the winners by 44 runs. Marple's lead is still a healthy 25 pts, second place Georgians going down by 11 runs in a great game at Macc, for whom Adam Longshaw made 105. Rhys Kibble made 106 for SG in reply but they finished just short. Maritime won a thriller with Dids 2As by 1 wkt to stay third, while Hyde's no.8 Hri Nath crashed a remarkable 107 off 49 bs to lift his side from 108-7 to 221 at home to Bowdon, Rabeel Ahmed then taking 7-37 as Hyde won by 83 runs. AE remain at the foot despite a fine 42 run win at Sale.

In **Div 2** the top two beat the bottom two, Swarn Sandhu's 7-47 helped leaders Warrington stay on top as they beat Haslington, while Grapenhall stayed second after a 4 wkt win at Ashley, who along with Has are well adrift. Upton 3s are third after a 6 wkt win over Cheadle Hulme while Heaton Mersey racked up 293-9 en-route to a thumping 179 run win over Oakmere to stay fourth.

Div 3 saw Timperley close the gap on leaders NE Cheshire after Felix Birtles smacked 136* (109 bs) in their sumptuous 313-8 against struggling Oulton Park, who folded for a meagre 150. NEC were well beaten by Stockport while third place Bollington lost a heartstopper at Hale Barns, HB getting from 235-8 to 264-9 to pinch a 1 wkt win. The Keenan boys put on an unbroken 135 to seal a 6 wkt win for Runcorn over Oxton 3's, Liam 73* and Matt 64*, a result which kept Oxton in the bottom two.

3rd XI League News Premier Division A terrific opening stand of 105 for Toft (Noah Wasilewski 65, Ollie Hamilton 67) put Toft on course for a healthy total, their 210-9 (Tom Linley 6-39) proving 15 too many for S.Georgians to chase, despite a super 84* from Hunain Khan. Brooklands thus went back to the summit after a DLS-adjusted 14 run win over Sale in a low-scoring encounter, while Didsbury bowled Marple/Compstall out for 82. Nantwich walloped Timperley by 9 wkts while Hyde v Ashley was cancelled due to a sodden outfield. Wins for both Elworth and Cheadle left it 'as you were' at the top of **Div 1** while in **Div 2** leaders Bredbury SM got an easy 20 pts after bottom side Davenham conceded, Didsbury 5s up into second after a rain-affected win over Georgians 4s. Urmston 4s got from 131-8 to 211-9 against Metrovicks but fell 9 runs short of a dramatic win. In **Div 3 East** Bolly 2s skipper Ryan Ouwerkerk turned out for the 3s and smashed 106 (65 bs) at no.8, he and Alex Sykes (80*) adding 175 for the 7th as the Macc Sun. XI had further penury, all out for 56 in reply to Bolly's 301-8.



1st XI FORZA T20 FINALS DAY

Lindow won their first major trophy after a 5 wkt win over Maritime in an enthralling final at Upcast Lane on Sunday.

Showery rain affected all three matches with both semi-finals reduced to 16 overs per side, and despite a heavier downpour at the end of the Maritime inns in the final, the day was completed successfully with a very good-sized crowd in attendance (including Geoffrey Boycott for a brief time). Skipper Alex Matthews was presented with the trophy by Ron Graham.



S/F 1: Lindow 134-5 (15.2 os) beat Hyde 131-8 (16 os) by 5 wkts *A delayed start after morning rain meant Lindow had no hesitation in bowling first, Finn Gavaghan's 4-23 a big factor in Hyde's struggle to build real momentum. In reply Lindow slipped from 54-2 to 75-5 as Hyde worked hard to defend their total, but Dan Newton was a class apart, his 73* (39 bs) steering his side to the brink of victory which Steve Price completed with a boundary.*

S/F 2: Maritime 138-9 (16 os) beat Nantwich 95 (13.5 os) by 43 runs

The big surprise of the day was provided by the Div 1 side who beat the joint-leaders of the Prem with something to spare in the end. Maritime found it tough going initially, 38-3 on the board after 7, but a burst of 45 off the next 3 changed things, Qasim Ali (62 off 31) playing a terrific hand. Nantwich replied brightly but lost three wkts in three ovs, including skipper Luke Robinson, as Vishal Barigela's spin bowling (3-20) gave Maritime an advantage they never let slip, the run-rate climbing steeply as wickets continued to fall. Bilal Anwar picked up 4-13 to go along with a catch and a useful 22 when batting.

Final: Lindow 143-5 (19 os) beat Maritime 140-8 (20 os) by 5 wkts *As was the case twelve months previously, the final was completed in stygian gloom as showery rain came and went during the match. With the pitch still giving the occasional low bounce, Maritime focused on occupying their 20 overs, Mickel Akeem Joseph making a superb 80* (55 bs) with one massive six in particular drawing gasps from the watching crowd. Lindow also assessed conditions well, knowing that partnerships were the key, and the 85 added by Jamieson Hedges (42 off 31) and Dan Newton (66* off 53) was the significant factor in Lindow's ultimate victory. Despite three wkts falling in nine balls, Lindow were so close to the line it came too late, and Newton's delighted roar of relief when Steve Price again hit a sweetly timed boundary to win the match was echoed by the many supporters of the host club who had stayed on to provide their backing. League Chairman David Humpage congratulated the winners and invited Ron Graham to present the trophy to Alex Matthews. Dan Newton won the umpires' award for standout player after two fine unbeaten innings.*
